The SEND Department at Honley has 10 teaching assistants and three inclusion workers. We are a forward thinking team and we are always looking for creative approaches to support out students and teachers. - To be part of the SEND team within the school where you will support students both within the classroom setting and also in small group interventions
- To work within a wide range of subject areas and support staff to deliver Quality First Teaching to our students.
- To communicate effectively with students, colleagues and their parents to effectively promote and support the wellbeing and safeguarding of all
- To engage fully with the school's professional development, quality assurance and performance management processes in order to develop practice and provide the highest standards of education and care for our young people

Key responsibilities:

Learning Support & Student Engagement

- To support students in lessons, under the direction of the class teacher, to achieve their full potential
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- To deliver small group interventions delivering bespoke intervention
- To assist in the provision of an effective learning experience for students with a variety of special educational needs and disabilities.
- Ensure progress of students is recorded in an appropriate way and relates to the individual student targets.
- Promote good behaviour and assist students to follow the school behaviour policy.
- To assist with target setting and completion of Additional Needs Plans in order to maximise student achievement
- To contribute to reviews and evaluations of pupils by completing reports on pupil progress
- To provide lunchtime cover/intervention activities if required
- To assist with the preparation and tidying of workspaces and upkeep of resources.
