What we do

Forget Me Not Children's Hospice supports children with life-shortening conditions, their families and families living with loss across West Yorkshire.

We're here for any family confronted with the news their child has a life-shortening condition, however, wherever and whenever they need us. By providing superb nursing care, hydrotherapy, creative therapy, days out, memory making, end of life care, bereavement support and counselling, Forget Me Not helps families make the most of every moment they have together.

Our services include caring for families during pregnancy and birth, as well as respite and clinical care, hospice at home, family support and support for those affected by the sudden and unexpected death of a child.

We provide these services to families across Kirklees, Calderdale, Bradford, Wakefield and Leeds. As a charity, we wouldn't be here without the support of the local community. Since 1998, when the charity was first set up, individuals, groups, businesses and organisations have been raising the funds we need to both provide essential care and to grow and develop what we do, so that more children and families get the support they need.

80p of every pound we spend goes directly in to providing care for children and families. The rest funds everything else we need to do to run our children's hospice, like fundraising and governance.

Working together for families


None of our work is possible without the best team giving their best. That's why we're #OneTeam

Looking after each other

We know our work isn't easy. And that we need to be at our best to give our best. So we look after each other too. Our wide-ranging wellbeing support includes resilience workshops, occupational health services and free 24/7 access to counselling, information and advice on a range of topics from family matters, relationships, debt management and workplace issues.

Benefits

Even more reasons to work at Forget Me Not:

- All our roles have been benchmarked against similar roles in the relevant industry and charity sector, to ensure our pay is competitive and fair
- We're working towards becoming a Real Living Wage employer
- An added value payment of 3% is available for those staff who gain additional qualifications outlined as desirable within the role description, take on additional responsibilities or have extensive additional experience
- 25 days holiday a year (pro rata for part-time roles), plus you get an extra day's holiday for every year you stay with us (to a maximum of 30 days pro rata)
- We are available to families 24/7 so our care staff receive enhancements for working evenings, weekends and bank holidays
- We support flexible and hybrid working, including working from home if your role allows
- All staff are entered into People's Pension, a simple, flexible and portable workplace pension
- We offer a generous death in service to all staff
- We have a wide range of personal and professional development opportunities tailored to your needs
- On joining Forget Me Not, you'll receive a full induction with your team and the wider organisation, as well as the training you need to get up to speed, ongoing support and personal development
- All staff can apply for a Blue Light card which offers discounts at hundreds of shops and services
- Free parking for those based at the hospice.

We will always interview you if you are an applicant with disability who meets the essential requirements of the job and we will provide adjustments to the recruitment process if required

Before you start

Because of the nature of our work, there are some key steps we need to take to protect those we support.

If you're successful at interview, you will be required to complete a Disclosure and Barring Service (Criminal Records Bureau) Check.

You'll also be asked to sign up to our Together for Families framework. This sets out what we expect from each and every one of our team. Put simply, we expect all our staff to always work with integrity and to respect others, to ensure we are trusted by our families, our teams and our supporters.

Because you'll get to use your unique talents, skills and experience to make a real difference to those families, whatever your role.
